

**WEXNER HERITAGE VILLAGE  
LONG-TERM CARE WORKER & WORKERS THAT SERVE ADULTS WITH  
DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES  
BACKGROUND CHECK (SENATE BILL 160/178) INFORMATION FORM**

Senate Bill 160/178 requires that we complete a background check of candidates. At the time of interview, all candidates at Wexner Heritage Village are required to complete and sign a consent form consenting to the submission of a request for a criminal record check for long-term care workers and workers that serve adults with Developmental Disabilities as required by the Federal Government and Senate Bill 160/178.

***Signing the form means:***

1. That you have not been convicted of, or plead guilty, or no contest to any of the crimes that would disqualify you from working with older adults and/or Developmentally Disabled Adults under Senate Bill 160/178. **(Please see the second page of this form for the list of crimes.)**
  2. That you understand and agree that if you are found to have a record of any of these crimes, you will not be hired for work with older adults and/or Developmentally Disabled Adults or, if you have already been hired, your employment will be terminated.
  3. That you were informed that you must provide a set of fingerprint impressions, and that a criminal record check must be conducted if you come under final consideration for employment.
  4. That you understand and agree to notify Human Resources within fourteen calendar days if, while employed by Wexner Heritage Village, you are formally charged with, convicted of, or plead guilty to any of the offenses listed on the reverse page. Failure to report may result in termination of employment.
  5. Senate Bill 160/178 also mandates that a residency, (address), verification be completed on every applicant who wishes to work in a long-term care setting or a setting that serves Adults with Developmental Disabilities. As such, you will be asked to provide information on whether you have been a resident of Ohio for the past 5 years and to list the addresses of your residences for the last 5 years.

Wexner Heritage Village may not place a person in a direct services position if the person has been convicted of or pleaded guilty to any of the above disqualifiers; and

A felony contained in the Revised Code that is not listed in paragraph of this rule, if the felony bears a direct and substantial relationship to the duties and responsibilities of the position being filled; and

Any offense contained in the Revised Code constituting a misdemeanor of the first degree on the first offense and a felony on a subsequent offense, if the offense bears a direct and substantial relationship to the position being filled and the nature of the services being provided;

A violation of an existing or former municipal ordinance or law of this state, any other state, or the United States, if the offense is substantially equivalent to any of the offenses listed or described in paragraphs above of this rule.
