When is it time for Hospice Care?

Criteria to look for when referring for Heart Disease/Heart Failure/CHF

When a combination of the following characteristics are present, a patient may qualify to recieve hospice care: <u>Functianlitiv</u>

• Fatigue.

- Palpitations.
- Angina or dsypnea at rest of with minimal exertion.

(Resistant to nitrate therapy and is not candidate for invasive procedures and/or has declinded. revascularizaton procedures)

- Chest pain.
- Impaired sleep function.

Conditions within the past 12 months

- Echo demonstrating an ejection fraction of 20% or less.
- Poor response to (or patient's choice is not to pursue) optimal treatment with diuretics, vasodilators and/or angiotensin converting enzyme (ACE) inhibitors.
- Treatment-resistant symptomatic dysythmias.
- History or unexplained or cardiac related syncope.
- CVA secondary to cardiac embolism.
- History of cardiac arrest or resuscitation.

**In the absence of one or more of these findings, rapid decline or comorbidities may also support eligibility for hospice care.

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
