When is it time for Hospice Care?

Criteria to look for when referring for Parkinson's Disease

When a combination of the following characteristics are present, a patient may qualify to recieve hospice care: Functianlitiv

- Porgression from independent ambulation to wheelchair of bed-bound status.
- Progression from normal to barely intelligible or unintelligible speech.
- Progression from normal to pureed diet.
- Progression from independence in most or all Activites of Daily Living (ADL) to need major. assistance by caretake in all ADLs.

Conditions within the past 12 months

- Oral intake of nutrients and fluids insufficient to sustain life.
- Continued weight loss.
- · Dehydtration or hypovolemia.
- Absense of artificial nourishment.
- Asperation Pneumonia.
- Urinary Tract Infection.
- Sepsis.
- Fever, recurrent after antibiotics.
- •Pressure Ulcers.
- **In the absence of one or more of these findings, rapid decline or comorbidities may also support eligibility for hospice care.

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
